Laurel Woods Goals

Math: The Howard County Public School System has adopted the Maryland College and Career-Ready Standards Curriculum. The mathematics curriculum will teach students: counting and cardinality; operations and algebraic thinking; number and operations in base ten; number and operations – fractions; measurement and data; and geometry.

Reading: All elementary grades will be taught the Maryland College and Career-Ready Standards English Language Arts Curriculum. These grade-by-grade standards in **reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language** create a steady progression of development leading to college and career readiness by the end of high school.

4th Grade Goals

Math: 100% of the fourth grade students will demonstrate growth of grade four fractions concepts.

Math: 100% of the third grade students will demonstrate growth of grade 4 problem solving concepts.

Reading: 100% of students will demonstrate growth towards mastery of the Maryland College and Career Readiness Standards as measured by the combined scores of the two On Demand Writing Assessments.

Reading: 100% of students will demonstrate growth towards mastery of the Maryland College and Career Ready Standards

As Parents, we will:

- Make sure our child eats a healthy breakfast each day and gets appropriate amount of sleep each night
- Be sure students arrive to school on time and ready to learn
- Monitor student folders and agenda books daily for information from teachers and school
- Make sure that homework is completed every night and foster positive study skills
- Participate in conferences, family programs, volunteer opportunities and attend PTA meetings when possible
- Respond in a timely manner to invitations, uphold our commitment to attend or notify the staff if there is a change
- Review the compact and code of conduct with our child

The Laurel Woods Staff will:

- Communicate regularly with families regarding students' academic progress and behavior through conferences, interpreter services, translated documents and discussions in their native language as necessary
- Provide high quality instruction and use data throughout the year to effectively group students and to plan differentiated activities
- Offer parents opportunities to volunteer in and out of school (field trips, PTA, classroom, SIT, etc.)
- Provide family programs based on student and parent needs
- Involve parents in making decisions related to whole school and Title I programs
- Transportation to family events may be available by request under certain circumstances

As Students, we will:

- Do my homework every night
- Be responsible for transporting information to and from school in agenda books and Friday folders
- Ask parents to sign permission slips and handouts
- Show effort, accuracy and persistence in our work
- Be actively engaged during all instruction and utilize strategies and manipulatives needed for success
- Follow the school rules by being respectful, responsible, safe and showing effort

Goal Setting is a very important component of academic and social success. **Each student has set an academic goal in his or her Math/Science and ELA classes.** Periodically, throughout the year, your child will bring home updates regarding the progress of their goal.
